## 2015: Trying New Things

Heading into a new year always makes me think of these verses from Isaiah 43:18-19:  
*Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old.  
I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?*

As we begin 2015, I have no doubt that it will be a year of doing things in new and different ways as a congregation. Here’s just one example:

Back in November, around 25 people were enjoying a Night Before Church Dinner on a Saturday night. There was great food and conversation, the kind of table fellowship that is at the heart of Christian community. But while the group was having a wonderful time they realized that families with children were missing. ***So they came up with an idea of how our church might change the way we do things in order to make it easier for those families.***

(WOW, do I love this willingness to try something new for the sake of others! I wasn’t there so I can’t take any credit. I can only express my appreciation for such flexibility and creativity. It is a characteristic that will serve our congregation very well as we head into a future in which the way the church has done things will most likely no longer serve us well.)

The idea was shared with Session, and Session enthusiastically decided to give it a go. So here is our great experiment:

As I write this, it is New Year's Eve, and Barb Bjork and Al and Becky Ahrens are busy compiling the year-end financial reports. I'm hardly a financial analyst, but I did a little number crunching of my own and discovered something.

Between 2009 and 2014, **giving in this congregation increased by 21 percent.** Wow!

Not only that, but this reflects giving to the general fund only, and does not include the capital campaigns. Add in a rather uncertain economy during much of these past five years, and there is only one conclusion I can reach:

***You are an incredibly generous group of people!** Thank you, thank you, thank you! Words simply cannot express my gratitude for your financial support of this congregation and the work we do here, in our communities, and beyond! We keep saying it, but that's because it is true—First Pres Mount Vernon IS making a difference!*

**This growth in generosity is so worth celebrating!**

But on the other hand, it is also true that **we finished 2014 in the red by just under \$9000 (as we expected).** The Session decided to cover the shortfall using \$5000 from Mary Byerly's estate and \$3850 from the Doris Whiting Estate Mission Funds to pay for our general mission pledge that supports the work of the Presbytery of East Iowa, the Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the General Assembly.

These two facts together—increased generosity, and a deficit budget—may leave you scratching your heads. To that end, the Finance Committee is offering:

## Star Gift Word

This is the fifth year our congregation has handed out a word printed on a star the Sunday closest to January 6th (Epiphany). The idea of these “Star Words” is that it is a Gift to us from God, something we receive without judgment, and then reflect on in the coming year. We trust that—somehow—God can use this particular word (regardless of whether we like it or would have chosen it for ourselves) to bless us.

Your Star Word could be...

- ...something you need more (or less!) of in your life
- ...a spiritual practice to focus your energies on
- ...a quality within you or in a relationship with someone else, or an attribute of God that could use your attention or consideration
- ...something that will bring you closer to God and bless you and those around you
- ...something you need to wrestle with in the coming year to gain understanding and insight

Some ideas of how to get started with your Star Word:

- Pray! Ask God to show you how in the world this word speaks to your life right now. And if you think you already know, ask God to take you deeper in your understanding.
- Look the word up in the dictionary, in the bible, on Google.
- Share your word with others and see what insights they have to offer.
- Post it on your mirror, the refrigerator, on the computer, wherever you can see it and keep the word in mind.
- Keep a running list of reflections on the word in a journal.



Most importantly, entrust yourself—and the word—to God!  
And see where it might take you...

## Worship in January

From now until the Sunday after Easter (April 12), we will be reading from the Gospel According to Matthew. Here's a brief introduction to Matthew, taken from the Connect Bible (NRSV, ©2012 sparkhouse):

**What's in a name?** Matthew was the name of one of Jesus' 12 disciples. This Gospel was probably named after him as a way of showing us how important the book is. Matthew the disciple is not likely the author, however, because the Gospel of Matthew was probably written in about 80 CE (50 years after Jesus died and was raised).

**Why was this written?** Matthew writes to declare Jesus as the fulfillment of the Old Testament—the Torah and the Prophets. Jesus is the long-awaited Messiah who has come to redeem the people. The people who heard the message of this Gospel needed to hear how God was still actively continuing the promises of old.

**What's the connection?** Matthew relies heavily on Mark's Gospel to tell the story of who Jesus the Messiah is. This Gospel also uses more quotes from the Old Testament than any other Gospel. Matthew's Gospel helps make a point about Jesus' place in Jewish history. Matthew's readers knew about the message of Israel's prophets. Matthew helps his readers to see that Jesus is the one the prophets had spoken about and hoped for.

### January 4 – Epiphany

Matthew 2:1-12 The Magi, visitors from foreign lands in the East, arrive in Jerusalem, seeking the newborn king of the Jews

*Sacrament of the Lord's Supper & Star Words*

### January 11 – The Baptism of Jesus

Matthew 3:1-17 John the Baptist is introduced and Jesus is baptized by him

*Reaffirmation of Baptism Service*

### January 18 – Tempted in the Wilderness

Matthew 4:1-17 Following his baptism, Jesus spends forty days and nights in the wilderness facing temptations from the devil. Afterwards, Jesus begins his ministry in Galilee.

*Presentation of Bibles to Third Graders (tentative)*

### January 25 – The Beatitudes

Matthew 5:1-20 In the opening words to the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), Jesus tells about those who are blessed in the kingdom of God, as well as being salt of the earth and light for the world.

### \*\*Saturday, January 31 – The Lord's Prayer
