We are composters. Well, haphazard composters, at least when it comes to keeping the right balance between nitrogen and carbon sources. Mostly we collect fruit and veggies scraps in a bucket and dump it in the two bins in the yard outside the walk-out basement door.

The purpose of compost is to turn food scraps and yard waste into a wonderful rich soil amendment. Because of that, it's not uncommon that seeds from food scraps grow in the compost piles.

Maybe it was all the rain in the early summer, maybe it was because we were so busy going to baseball games that I didn't get the plants pulled when they were just sprouts, but this year our compost bins had lots of things growing in them—tomato plants and a couple of vines. I can't say if it was more laziness or curiosity, but I let them grow. I was especially curious about the vine. Was it a cucumber, a squash, or a melon?

July and much of August went by in a blur and not much yard work happened. Yesterday morning I headed out to the compost bins with a bucket of food scraps thinking, I should really do something about the vine that has taken over the yard here. It's out of control! And that's when I noticed it: while I wasn't looking or paying attention, this vine was producing a good-sized butternut squash!

This was especially funny to me because our plan was to have two raised vegetable garden beds this summer. We got the frames built, but never got soil in them. Among other things, I was planning to grow tomatoes and butternut squash. Ha!

There are at least two lessons here:

God is always doing things in our midst of which we are completely unaware. It is not all up to us to make anything and everything happen. This is one of the lessons that the practice of Sabbath is intended to teach.

God takes the things we consider useless—like food scraps—and makes something of them. New fruit. New life. New possibilities.

I invite you to think about the times in your life when God has been at work, making good things happen in the places, people and situations you had perhaps

given up on. And, be encouraged that this is *still happening* in our own lives, in our congregation, in our wider world. God's creative work is ongoing. Thanks be to God for this!

Choir Space---Finished??!?


As I write this, we are virtually done with this project.

Session met on Wednesday, August 14 at 6:30 pm in the Community Room.

- Approved letter of transfer for Phyllis Hodina to Salem United Methodist Church in Cedar Rapids.
- Financial Report—we have not borrowed any money through mid-August but anticipate that will change over the coming months. We have enough money in the Building Fund (to pay the mortgage) for another year.
- Approved Healing Touch Circle's use of the Community Room the second Sunday of each month
- Approved request to move choir rehearsal space to the Community Room
- Approved August Noisy Offering to go to Presbytery of Mississippi for ministry to families affected by ICE raids.
- Snow Removal—Larry Petrick received contract from M&K for plowing and sanding.
 Always a concern about ice build up and traction on the hill. Ed Bjork will talk with Nick Nissen at the city about treating the hill and the part the city owns.
- Office Manager Cheryl Jackson is resigning, effective September 4. She had another job offer come along that she simply could not refuse. Marie Riechers, who had applied in May, was offered the position and accepted! She will begin "shadowing" Cheryl the week of August 20.
- Zane Marshall completed her application to enroll as an Inquirer for Ministry with
 the Presbytery of East Iowa. Carole Frazee, Larry Petrick, Larry Purvis and Lori Wunder
 met with Zane in July and Carole completed the recommendation on behalf of the
 Session. Zane was given \$300 from the Keedick-Dolezal Scholarship Fund for her
 studies this fall at University of Dubuque Theological Seminary.
- Choir Space update—as of the meeting, we were waiting on the carpet to be installed, chairs to be delivered and the last electrical and sound work to be completed.
 We will celebrate in worship on September 8!
- "Paris to Pittsburgh," a National Geographic documentary about how communities around the world are responding to climate change locally, will be shown at the First Street Community Center. Roger Johanson will invite attendees to participate in the Pro-Future Faith 8 week study.

Noisy Offering

September 22 – Zacchaeus the Wealthy Tax Collector: Radical Unraveling of Vocation
Luke 19:1-10 – Zacchaeus is a wealthy tax collector, which means he is not welcomed or wanted
by most. Jesus flips the script by inviting Zacchaeus to offer him hospitality, which unravels
the crowd's expectations since they deem Zacchaeus a sinner and an unworthy host.

September 29 – The Conversion of Saul to Paul: Discovering a New Path

Acts 9:1-20 – In a flash in the middle of the road, God unravels Saul's identity as a persecutor of Christ-followers and invites him to blindly stumble onto a new path. His conversion requires Ananias, a disciple vulnerable to Paul's threats, to place his hands on Saul's eyes so that he might see the world anew as Paul the Apostle. Sometimes God calls us into uncharted territory, and maybe our unraveling is simply a holy, fresh start.
