### LETTER FROM PASTOR LORI Joy to the World!

I love Joy to the World. Truthfully, I would sing it all yearlong and not just in December. Even so, it is one of the songs that makes Christmas for me.

Since I get to decide these things, Joy to the World is the last song we sing at the Christmas Eve service. Everything else is just leading up to that moment. We sing Silent Night with our candles lit, and then after a brief prayer, move into an enthusiastic rendition of Joy to the World.

And it is JOY that fills the room and everyone in it. Joy because of the beauty of the space, the candlelight, the music, the story, the season. Joy because of the tenderness of friends, family and strangers crowded in together.

During Advent this year, we will be focusing on Joy to the World.

The season of Advent—the four weeks leading up to Christmas—are intended to be about preparation, penitence, taking an honest look at our world and ourselves. So, isn't focusing on joy cheating?

I did worry about this a little bit. In our cultural observance of Christmas (in which there is no Advent), the emphasis is on picture-perfect, things being shiny and bright, even excessive. It can be a very difficult time of year for anyone who isn't "feeling it." (Which is part of the reason I value the tradition of a reflective, somber season of Advent.)

Joy and happiness are different. Happy tends to be a response to something that happens to us. Joy, on the other hand, is more internal.

According to the Bible (Galatians 5), joy is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit, second only to love. Theopedia defines joy as "a state of mind and an orientation of the heart." Joy is not dependent on everything in my life going right. It is a choice, made possible by the presence of the Spirit. Joy is a gift from God.

During our exploration of joy in December we will also acknowledge the ways in which the world is not right, the places of suffering and brokenness.

As Archbishop Desmond Tutu says in The Book of Joy, "We are fragile creatures, and it is from this weakness, not despite it, that we discover the possibility of true joy."

At the heart of the song, Joy to the World, is the refrain, Let every heart prepare Him room. May all of us find moments and ways to do that in this Advent and Christmas season.



#### FINANCIAL UPDATE

As of October 31, 2019

- Total INCOME
  - \$126,727.31 (includes \$5500 "loan" to cover expenses)
- Total EXPENSES
  - \$127,000.52
- Deficit
  - · -\$273.21

Back in January 2019, the Finance Committee and the Session predicted we could have a deficit as high as \$40,000. Currently, that prediction is more in the \$10-15,000 range. This is still a deficit, of course, but we are doing our best to move things in a positive direction.

#### Here's what's happening:

- We continue to keep our expenses down, carefully watching what we can.
   Custodian Terry Jackson tries really hard to do his work in five hours, putting that line item well under budget. After spending so much on snow removal last winter, volunteers mowing the lawn this summer helped us out, too.
- Our Annual Auction was a big success, raising just under \$6500! Thank you to
  everyone who helped make it happen, from running it the day of to donating
  items to bidding on items.
  - Pre-Sale \$880.00
  - Silent Auction \$418.00
  - Live Auction \$4,895.00
  - o Free Will Table \$61.00
  - Straight Donations \$175.00
- We have had a handful of new pledges since the start of 2019. These make a difference. Thank you so much!

#### How can you help?

- Consider an additional, End of the Year Gift. Back in January, we asked for a
  "13th Month of Giving," an extra financial gift beyond what was pledged. We've
  received \$2464 in "extra" gifts this year. Any amount helps and makes a
  difference!
- Pay the Per Capita cost for yourself and/or your family. Per Capita, or "per member," supports the work and mission of the PC(USA) at the presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly levels. Our congregation's share is \$5054 which we pay to the Presbytery of East lowa to be shared with the other mid-councils.
  - If you would like to contribute your/your family's share of the per capita cost, it is \$38 per member. A member has formally joined, including confirmation.
     Children (whether baptized or not) are not included in the per capita apportionment. If you have questions, contact the church office.

Numbers, of course, only tell part of the story. There are many good things happening in our congregation. Thank you for the financial support that makes it possible!

## 300 YEARS OF "JOY TO THE WORLD!"

## SUNDAYS AT 9:30AM | FIRST PRES MV

"Joy to the World," a beloved Christmas classic, turns 300 this year. Hymn poet Isaac Watt's interpretation of Psalm 98 invites us to sing a "new song"—and it is a powerful cosmic performance of all creation being renewed and freed. Rather than "joy" being yet another word for "happiness," we will discover that the depths of joy can be found especially in the midst of suffering, the work of justice, and the presence of compassion—all part of the coming of Jesus to this world and a message the world still so desperately needs.

#### December 1- Prepare Him Room: Hopeful Joy- Sacrament of the Lord's Supper

The season of Advent is a time of anticipation. In the momentous conversation between Archbishop Desmond Tutu and the Dalai Lama that resulted in the publication of the Book of Joy, one of the "pillars" of joy they identified was "perspective." Opening ourselves to a different perspective can bring a sense of hope in the midst of despair–allowing joy to creep in no matter what. Opening to the perspectives of others can shift our fear to compassion, turning swords into plows. Salvation is near, says the scripture, when we wake up, when we prepare room in our lives for new Light, new insight, new hope to enter.

#### December 8- Repeat the Sounding Joy: Loving Joy- December Birthday Blessing

Research shows that our very state of being can be transformed by music that resonates in our soul so powerfully that we can't help but join in. This is the vision of "Joy to the World" as the reverberating phrase urges us to "repeat the sounding joy" of the good news of Love. The prophet Isaiah offers a vision of radical love–the wolf and the lamb living together and being led by an innocent child. Can we lift our voices to joyfully and confidently proclaim this chorus of well–being for the world? This week we join creation and congregation in praising and thanking God.

**December 15-** Make the Blessings Known: Unabashed Joy- Children's Program & Noisy Offering Joy doesn't wait for struggle to be over. Mary "rejoices" in the iconic scripture passage during her pregnancy, a state of affairs that would have put her in a position of dishonor among her people. Instead, she sings out powerfully because she knows that this turn of events will usher in the Presence of justice for the oppressed and freedom for the captive. As we join in a prophetic chorus of joy together, we are more deeply bonded as a whole, multiplying and magnifying the exuberance to all.


