



2015: Trying New Things

Last month, I talked about one of the new things our congregation was willing to try. This month, I want to report back on them!

January 31-February 1 Re-Creation (Eat In, Sleep In) Weekend

This event had long been on the calendar, but when the forecast started showing a big snowstorm for Saturday night into Sunday, we looked REALLY smart!





The feedback on this experiment was very positive. We even heard from people who had conflicts that day who hoped we will plan another. Let me or any member of Session know what you think!

S.E.R.I. (Sustainable Energy and Resources Initiative)

In the fall, Steve Maurice and I had a conversation about the importance of churches getting the word out about God's desire for us to be good stewards of all of creation. We quickly realized this needed to be a community-wide effort. So, with the Session's approval, Steve and I invited a group of interested persons (Cornell professors Andy McCollum and Brian Nowak-Thompson, sustainable farmer Laura Krouse, city council person Marianne Taylor, "butterfly lady" Patty Ankrum) to an initial meeting last January and S.E.R.I. was born!

During that first meeting, I was asked if the Presbyterians have ever considered 1) becoming an Earth Care Congregation (i.e. deliberately evaluating our energy usage and stewardship of resources) or 2) installing solar panels on our roof to provide the bulk of our electricity. I asked the Session these same questions and they agreed—if we have people in the congregation interested in exploring these options, we should see about it.

So, if either (or both!) of those issues is a passion or interest for you, let me or any member of Session know and we will be grateful to put you to work on behalf of God's beautiful creation!

WHAT IS "PER CAPITA"?

Many church members are aware of the explanation of "Per Capita," but there are also many who are not sure what "Per Capita" means. It is our dues to the Presbyterian Church USA and a way of sharing administrative costs that belong to the whole Presbyterian Church community.

This year (2015) the cost is \$34.27 per active member bringing our total share to \$5,072.00. This amount is shared with the General Assembly, the Lakes and Prairies Synod and our Presbytery of East Iowa.

Each year we ask members to consider contributing an additional gift to help with the payment of our Per Capita.



Healing Touch Circle

Second Sundays (February 8, March 8, April 12) First Pres MV's Community Room

Healing Touch is a form of complementary medicine that supports the body's natural healing processes. Christianity has a long tradition of laying on of hands



Since December, our church has been hosting a monthly Healing Circle. A group of women and men in the Mount Vernon, Lisbon and surrounding areas trained in Healing Touch or Energy Work gather together to volunteer our time to extend a time of prayer and energy work to our local community.

Healing Touch can be beneficial for illness, chronic pain, depression or simply to receive a "boost." People wanting to receive a Healing Touch treatment are invited to register for a 30 minute session that involves a laying on of hands and a 15 minute prayer or meditation including an offering of gratitude and petition. This 30 minute energy treatment and 15 minute prayer time takes place in a group setting with each practitioner working one-on-one with a recipient. All are welcome!

Recipient spaces are limited to the amount of volunteer practitioners that commit their time and skill every month. To register for a spot, go to this website and follow the links: http://mtvchc.wix.com/mount-vernon-chc

Worship in February

From now until the Sunday after Easter (April 12), we are reading from the Gospel According to Matthew. Jesus, as described by Matthew, proclaims the kingdom of heaven, performs miracles and teaches his followers what it means to be righteous and how to enter God's kingdom.

"Righteous" for us today can be a negative term, usually associated with "self-righteous." But righteousness for Jesus was about life lived in restored relationship with God by showing allegiance to God and God's desire for justice in word and action.

Our readings in February continue to reveal who Jesus is and what living in God's way with righteousness looks like.

February 8 – Feeding the 5000

Matthew 14:13-33 Jesus feeds the 5000 then walks on the water *Sacrament of the Lord's Supper*

February 15 – Take Up Your Cross and the Transfiguration

Matthew 16:24-17:8 Jesus tells the disciples that all who want to come after him must take up their cross and follow him. Six days later, Peter, James, and John see Jesus transfigured on a mountain top.
