The Heart of Lent

The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday (February 18 this year) and ends on the Saturday before Easter (April 4). This means that this year, the month of March is what we might consider the heart of Lent.

Lent is forty days long (Sundays don't count!) and is intended to be a season of intentional "taking stock" of our relationship with God. This can include Lenten disciplines and practices such as giving something up, fasting from particular foods (or behaviors), prayer, study and giving.

For some of you, Lent and Lenten practices may not be something you grew up with. I grew up in the Presbyterian Church and didn't attend my first Ash Wednesday service until high school and had never heard of giving something up until college.

The truth is, observing Lent beyond my preparation for worship services is not something I do well, and I suspect that is true for many of you, too. But I am also a firm believer that any effort, no matter how small or slight, toward deepening our relationship with God is important, and does more than we know.

This year, my small effort is to keep the dining room table at home free of clutter, with a centerpiece of objects that invite me to reflection—a candle, a cross, a plant, seashells, seeds, sand, a compass, and a prayer, which I offer to you here:

A Prayer for Lent

Loving God,
During the sacred season of Lent,
bring me closer to you.
Prepare a place in my home and heart
for solitude and reflection,
so that I may rediscover the grace of a prayer-full life.
Help me to fast from those things that threaten
the well-being of body and soul and remind me of the grace of simplicity.
Enlarge my heart so that I may give to those in need
and, in so doing, rediscover the grace of gratitude and generosity.
May this season be a grace-filled time to rekindle my love for and faith in you.
Amen.

May this season of Lent bless and strengthen you, and deepen you in God's grace.

WHAT IS "PER CAPITA"?



Many church members are aware of the explanation of "Per Capita," but there are also many who are not sure what "Per Capita" means. It is our dues to the Presbyterian Church USA and a way of sharing administrative costs that belong to the whole Presbyterian Church community.

This year (2015) the cost is \$34.27 per active member bringing our total share to \$5,072.00. This amount is shared with the General Assembly, the Lakes and Prairies Synod and our Presbytery of East Iowa.

Each year we ask members to consider contributing an additional gift to help with the payment of our Per Capita.

Healing Touch Circle

Second Sundays (March 8, April 12) - First Pres MV's Community Room

Healing Touch is a form of complementary medicine that supports the body's natural healing processes. Christianity has a long tradition of laying on of hands for healing; similar practices have spanned many other cultures and religions all over the world.

Since December, our church has been hosting a monthly Healing Circle. A group of women and men in the Mount Vernon, Lisbon and surrounding areas trained in Healing Touch or Energy Work gather together to volunteer our time to extend a time of prayer and energy work to our local community.



Healing Touch can be beneficial for illness, chronic pain, depression or simply to receive a "boost." People wanting to receive a Healing Touch treatment are invited to register for a 30 minute session that involves a laying on of hands and a 15 minute prayer or meditation including an offering of gratitude and petition. This 30 minute energy treatment and 15 minute prayer time takes place in a group setting with each practitioner working one-on-one with a recipient. All are welcome!

Recipient spaces are limited to the amount of volunteer practitioners that commit their time and skill every month.

Back in the fall, Steve Maurice approached Pastor Lori Wunder about the importance of pastors preaching about care of creation issues. During that conversation they agreed this is an issue that needs the attention of not only our churches, but the entire community. With that, Steve and Lori invited several people from the community to brainstorm what we might do to be good stewards of the natural resources entrusted to us. From the beginning, our Session has been supportive of this endeavor.

Those in the first group are Patty Ankrum (Monarchs in Eastern Iowa), Brian Novak-Thompson (Assoc. Professor of Biology and Chemistry, Cornell), Laura Krouse (Abbe Hills Farm), Steve Maurice (Catalyst for Change), Andy McCollum (Professor of Biology, Cornell College), Marianne Taylor (Mount Vernon City Council Member), and Pastor Lori Wunder.

This group came up with a name and the following mission statement:

"Because our natural resources are finite, precious and irreplaceable, the mission of S.E.R.I. (Sustainable Energy and Resource Initiative) is to encourage the stewardship of energy, water, land, air and biological diversity in order to enhance the quality of life for all of us.

To accomplish this we will advocate for the responsible and thoughtful use of the natural resources through educational outreach and demonstration projects and advocacy aimed at facilitating creative and meaningful action by all members of our community."

Why SERI? Because God created the world and everything in it and called it good (Genesis 1), and created humankind to serve as caretakers of both the animals and the land (Genesis 1:28). For generations, human beings have experienced God's presence and mystery in the incredible beauty of the natural world, from the smallest seed to the tallest mountain.
