

#### Summer Reading List

One of the many things people look forward to in summer is having time to read.

A couple of weeks ago, I ordered this pile of books in anticipation of tending my mind and spirit more intentionally during June, July and August (even though I started reading some of them in May!).

So when, at the same time, I was trying to figure out what to preach on this summer, it occurred to me: what if we did a sermon series based on a book those who were interested in could read along with me?



It didn't take long to think of the book.

An Altar in the World: A Geography of Faith by Barbara Brown Taylor is, in many

ways, the perfect book for a summer preaching series. In this book, Taylor encourages her readers to expand their understanding of where God is (hint: it's not only in the sanctuary!) and what God is up to (hint: it doesn't only happen in church!).


Taylor writes, "...my hope is that reading [these pages] will help you recognize some of the altars in this world—ordinary-looking places where human beings have met and may continue to meet up with the divine More that they sometimes call God."

In each chapter she pairs a practice with a religious idea or concept. For example, the practice of *paying attention* is

paired with *reverence* and the practice of *living with purpose* is paired with *vocation*. Each Sunday, worship and the sermon will be inspired by a chapter, practice and idea, as well as a scripture reading (or two) that goes along with it.

Summer can get so busy that it is easy to be disconnected from church and worship. My hope is that by offering a sermon series on *An Altar in the World*, whether you are here in body or not, your spirit may be fed and you can feel connected to what is happening in our congregation.

One of my favorite lines in the book is this: Earth is so thick with divine possibility that it is a wonder we can walk anywhere without cracking our shins on altars. It seems to me that this awareness of God in the world is exactly what summer should be about!

#### Highlights from May 18, 2015 Session Meeting

**PRESENT:** Don Burch, Carol Dillard, Paul Jerabek, Beth Simon, Amy Weber, and clerk, Rozanne Petrick and moderator Lori Wunder.

**ABSENT:** Becky Ahrens, Nate Willems, Sue Deibner, Stephanie West, Shelley Woodley, James Cannon, and David Taylor.

The meeting began with us watching a Nooma DVD on prayer, and followed by a prayer. The Financial Report showed April income at \$7960.16 and April expenses at \$11,535.74. An annual transfer of music funds will go into the budget soon. Lori reported that the Mount Vernon High School robotics team gave the church \$100 as a token of their appreciation for the use of our building.

Memorial funds in memory of Dorothy Ward were designated for the New Building fund in the amount of \$1075. 32 plastic folding chairs with cart have been purchased from Costco with Memorial funds. Old metal chairs and other broken chairs will be taken by Paul to Marion Iron Works. Session approved a \$500 financial gift (from mission funds from undesignated gifts) to Presbyterian World Mission to help keep mission workers in the field.

#### **DISCUSSIONS**

Fellowship Hour is a concern. Lori and Rozanne will work together on some type of communication to the congregation in hopes of getting an active kitchen committee together to be responsible for supplies, etc. Session recommended using general budget funds and requesting donations. A painted wall "tree" was described by Lori for the Community Room. Local artist, Steph Abresch, will be contacted about doing the work. Memorial Funds would be used and Rozanne will contact some families about this project.

Lori reported that the SERI group has decided to use Maurice Foundation funds to offer a \$100 rebate on rain barrel purchases or installation to help Mount Vernon and Lisbon with stormwater management. The SERI group is also in favor of monarch butterfly gardens; Lori and Paul will work with Andy McCollum of Cornell College on possible native plants for our property.

A New Members Class will be held after worship on Sundays May 31, June 7, and June 14. Those deciding to join will be received into our congregation on June 21. She encouraged present members to also attend.


For the summer, we're starting off with a two-part series on the Trinity, inspired by a question about the Trinity, why we even have it and why it matters.

- Neighborhood Building includes organizing multi-block sustainable reinvestment in targeted neighborhoods through simultaneous new home construction, home restorations and public policy advocacy
- **Cultivate Hope** includes growing pesticide- and herbicide-free produce at an urban farm and five school gardens
- Youth Empowerment includes providing reading buddles during the school year and Groundswell, a neighborhood gathering space and youth arts venue
