*PRAYER OF RECONCILIATION FOR ADVENT

P: Show us the world as you see it, riddled by debt, deceit and disbelief, yet also shot through with possibility for recovery, renewal, redemption.

L: And lest we fail to distinguish vision from fantasy, today, tomorrow, this week, open our eyes to one person or one place, where we might identify a need and make a difference, no matter how small. And with all this, open our eyes, in yearning, for Jesus.

All: On the mountains, in the cities, through the corridors of power and streets of despair, to help, to heal, to confront, to convert, O Come, O come, Immanuel. (From

There is strife, and conflict abounds.

The Instruction is ineffective.

Reader 2: Then the Lord answered me and said,

Write a vision, and make it plain upon a tablet

so that a runner can read it.
