PRELUDE RINGING OF THE HOUR

WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Leader: The Lord be with you. **ALL: And also with you.**

*CALL TO WORSHIP

Leader: Come, it is the time for worship —

ALL: the time we come together in praise and prayer.

*CALL TO CONFESSION & PRAYER OF RECONCILIATION

Leader: To truly come before God requires that we are first honest with ourselves about who we are, about the mistakes we make, and about how well or poorly we care for others.

In this spirit, let us offer our prayers to God:

ALL: You invite us to pay attention, O God —

to notice the people around us,

even when we might easily get wrapped up in our own plans or habits.

We confess that we often do not notice the ways our habits and plans exclude others.

Until it happens to us, we don't see the people who cannot get in to our spaces,

who cannot access our community.

We confess that we prefer to look away from those who make us uncomfortable,

whose bodies or minds or spirits work differently from ours,

whose life experiences challenge our worldviews.

Forgive us, God of inclusion,

when we look past exclusion and think we cannot change it,

because it's the way it's always been.

Forgive us, God of the downtrodden,

when we look away from those we don't think deserve our help.

Forgive us, God of the impossible,

when we limit your love to a transaction,

refusing to take a risk that might lead us past what we think we are capable of.

Expand our imagination,

to the possibility of healing,

to the possibility of resurrection,

to the possibility of amazement,

to the possibility of community,

to the possibility of love.

We ask in the name of the One who makes all things possible: Jesus the Christ. Amen.

SCRIPTURE READING

Leader: In the beginning was the Word.

ALL: And the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

Leader: And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.

Acts 3:1-10 (Common English Bible) – Peter Heals

Reader 1: Peter and John were going up to the temple at three o'clock in the afternoon, the established prayer time. ² Meanwhile, a man crippled since birth was being carried in. Every day, people would place him at the temple gate known as the Beautiful Gate so he could ask for money from those entering the temple. ³ When he saw Peter and John about to enter, he began to ask them for a gift. ⁴ Peter and John stared at him. Peter said, "Look at us!" ⁵ So the man gazed at them, expecting to receive something from them.

Reader 2: ⁶ Peter said, "I don't have any money, but I will give you what I do have. In the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, rise up and walk!" ⁷ Then he grasped the man's right hand and raised him up. At once his feet and ankles became strong. ⁸ Jumping up, he began to walk around. He entered the temple with them, walking, leaping, and praising God. ⁹ All the people saw him walking and praising God. ¹⁰ They recognized him as the same one who used to sit at the temple's Beautiful Gate asking for money. They were filled with amazement and surprise at what had happened to him.
