however dimly it may seem to shine now.

We ask in the name of the coming Prince of Peace, Jesus the Christ.

Joel 2:12-29 (Common English Bible) – God's Judgment and Call to Repentance

Reader 1: Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your hearts,

with fasting, with weeping, and with sorrow;

¹³tear your hearts and not your clothing.

Return to the Lord your God, for he is merciful and compassionate,

very patient, full of faithful love, and ready to forgive.

¹⁴Who knows whether he will have a change of heart and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the Lord your God?

Reader 2: ¹⁵ Blow the horn in Zion; demand a fast;

- request a special assembly.
- ¹⁶Gather the people; prepare a holy meeting; assemble the elders;

gather the children, even nursing infants.

Let the groom leave his room and the bride her chamber.

¹⁷ Between the porch and the altar let the priests, the Lord's ministers, weep.

Let them say, "Have mercy, Lord, on your people,

and don't make your inheritance a disgrace, an example of failure among the nations. Why should they say among the peoples, 'Where is their God?'"

Reader 1: ²⁵ I will repay you for the years that the cutting locust,

the swarming locust, the hopping locust, and the devouring locust have eaten my great army, which I sent against you.

²⁶ You will eat abundantly and be satisfied,

and you will praise the name of the Lord your God, who has done wonders for you; and my people will never again be put to shame.

²⁷You will know that I am in the midst of Israel, and that I am the Lord your God no other exists; never again will my people be put to shame.

Reader 2: ²⁸ After that I will pour out my spirit upon everyone;

your sons and your daughters will prophesy,

your old men will dream dreams, and your young men will see visions.

²⁹ In those days, I will also pour out my spirit on the male and female slaves.
